**TOP STORYLINES**

- Appalachian State University football opens one of the most anticipated seasons in school history on Saturday when it hosts Howard at Kidd Brewer Stadium.
- Appalachian State carries the nation's fifth-longest winning streak into Saturday's season opener.
- After winning six-straight games to close out the 2014 campaign, only Ohio State (13-straight wins), Boise State (9), TCU (8) and Memphis (7) bring longer winning streaks into the 2015 campaign than Appalachian.
- The Mountaineers return 20 offensive and defensive starters (10 offense, 10 defense) from last year's squad, which finished 7-5 overall and 6-2 (third place) in Sun Belt Conference play in their first season in the Sun Belt and NCAA Division I FBS.
- App State is opening the season at home for the first time in 14 years. The Mountaineers have not opened at home since Sept. 1,

2001, when they defeated Liberty, 46-26.

- Appalachian State is 47-35-3 (.571) all-time in season openers but just 3-10 in its last 13 openers, which were all played on the road.
- The Mountaineers are 62-20-2 (.750) all-time in home openers, including a 25-5 all-time mark when it opens the season at home.
- Appalachian State and Howard are meeting for the first time in football.
- While the Mountaineers and Bison are squaring off for the first time on the grid-iron, Appalachian is no stranger to Howard's league, the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. App State faced MEAC competition seven times in its final six seasons in NCAA Division I FCS (2008-13) and won six of those seven matchups. The Mountaineers are 11-3 all-time versus MEAC opponents.
- Like Appalachian State, Howard rides some momentum into the season opener after clos-

ing 2014 on a strong note. The Bison opened last season with just one win in their first eight games but closed the campaign with four-straight victories to finish 5-7 overall and 3-5 in MEAC play (tied for seventh).

- Also like Appalachian, Howard brings back a multitude of starters from last season. The Bison return a total of 18 offensive and defensive starters from last year's squad (nine on offense, nine on defense).
- Saturday's key matchup pits Howard's offense, which led the MEAC in yards per game last year (384.8 avg.), against Appalachian State's defense, which allowed the fewest yards per game (347.5 avg.) in the Sun Belt a season ago.
- Appalachian State begins the quest for its first-ever NCAA bowl appearance on Saturday. The Mountaineers completed an NCAA-mandated two-year transition from Division I FCS to Division I FBS last season and are eligible for bowl consideration in 2015.



**AN APPALACHIAN STATE WIN WOULD ...**

- move to 1-0 on the season.
- extend its winning streak to seven games.
- be its first in a season opener since a 42-41 season-opening win at Chattanooga on Sept. 4, 2010.
- be only its fourth victory in its last 14 season openers.
- be its 12th-straight victory in a season opener played at home.
- be its 28th win in its last 32 home openers.
- move to 12-3 all-time against MEAC competition.

**AN APPALACHIAN STATE LOSS WOULD ...**

- fall to 0-1 for the 11th time in the last 14 seasons.
- snap its winning streak at six games.
- be its first in a season opener played at home since a 42-7 loss to Western Kentucky on Sept. 8, 1973.
- be its second loss in its last three home openers, which has not occurred since the Mountaineers lost back-to-back home openers in 1982 (Furman, 27-21) and 1983 (James Madison, 24-20).
- fall to 11-4 all-time against MEAC members.

**NOTING HOWARD**

- Despite being separated by only 423 miles and having 207 combined seasons of football history, Appalachian State and Howard are meeting on the gridiron for the first time.
- Howard went 5-7 overall in 2014, including a 3-5 record in Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference play (tied for seventh).
- Much like Appalachian State, the Bison had a slow start in 2014, winning just one of their first eight games, but finished strong with four-straight triumphs to close out the season.
- Despite the four-game winning streak to close the 2014 campaign and the return of 18 offensive and defensive starters from last year's squad (nine offense, nine defense), Howard was picked to finish ninth out of 11 teams in the preseason MEAC coaches poll.
- The low expectations for the Bison can likely be attributed to the graduation of quarterback Greg McGhee. A four-year starter, McGhee was the MEAC Co-Offensive Player of the Year as a senior in 2014 after accounting for a conference-best 3,235 yards of total

offense (2,388 passing and 847 rushing) and 28 touchdowns (15 passing, 13 rushing). McGhee is now a member of the Canadian Football League's B.C. Lions.

- Howard led the MEAC in total offense last season with 384.8 yards per game.
- The Bison finished ninth in the MEAC in total defense last season at 418.5 yards allowed per game. They were especially susceptible against the pass, finishing last in the 11-team MEAC at 239.8 yards allowed per game through the air.
- Howard hasn't won a season opener against an NCAA Division I opponent since 2002, when it beat Texas Southern, 34-31.
- The Bison's only two victories in their last 12 season openers came against Division II opponents Winston-Salem State (20-6 in 2005) and Morehouse (30-29 in 2012).

**APPALACHIAN STATE vs. MEAC**

- Appalachian State is 11-3 all-time versus current members of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- Appalachian has won six of its last seven matchups against MEAC competition.
- The Mountaineers defeated MEAC champion South Carolina State in the opening round of the 2008 and 2009 NCAA Division I FCS playoffs, downed North Carolina Central in 2009 and 2010 and routed North Carolina A&T and Savannah State on consecutive weeks in 2011.
- However, in App State's last contest against a MEAC opponent, N.C. A&T stunned the Mountaineers, 24-21, in Appalachian's 2013 home opener (Sept. 7, 2013).

- Appalachian State's six-game winning streak began with a 53-14 win at Troy on Oct. 18 of last season.
- Appalachian won its final six games of last season by an average score of 41-20.
- All six wins came against Sun Belt Conference opponents. Prior to beginning the streak with the 53-14 win at Troy on Oct. 18, 2014, the Mountaineers had dropped 10-straight decisions to NCAA Division I FBS opponents, dating back to their historic 34-32 win at Michigan on Sept. 1, 2007.

- App State's six-game winning streak is its longest since it won eight-straight games to open the 2010 season.

- Saturday's season opener versus Howard marks 329 days since the Mountaineers' last loss, a 55-48 overtime defeat to Liberty on Oct. 11, 2014.

APPALACHIAN STATE BECOMES BOWL ELIGIBLE IN 2015

• After completing an NCAA-mandated two-year reclassification process from Division I FCS to Division I FBS, Appalachian State is eligible to receive a postseason bowl bid in 2015.

• Appalachian is seeking its first-ever NCAA bowl berth.

• Prior to joining the NCAA Division I ranks in 1971, the Mountaineers participated in 10 postseason bowl games at the NAIA level.

• Appalachian is 4-6 all-time in bowl games.

• The Mountaineers' last bowl appearance came on Nov. 24, 1955, when it lost the Burley Bowl in Johnson City, Tenn. to East Tennessee State, 7-0.

• To be eligible for bowl consideration, Appalachian State must win at least six regular-season games in 2015.

NATIONAL RANKINGS

• While Appalachian State is in its first season as a member of NCAA Division I FBS, it has a history with the Associated Press Top 25 poll.

• Appalachian State's 34-32 win over No. 5 Michigan in 2007 prompted the AP to make all NCAA Division I teams eligible to receive votes in its Top 25 poll. Prior to Appalachian's historic win at Michigan, voters could only include NCAA Division I FBS teams on their ballots. The new policy was dubbed the "Appalachian State Rule" by some.

• Following the policy shift, App State received votes in the AP Top 25 poll on three occasions in 2007, including seven points in the season's final poll, good for a tie for 34th overall.

• The Mountaineers are 1-3 all-time against nationally ranked FBS opponents.

• Appalachian State will likely get its fifth crack at a nationally ranked FBS opponent next Saturday (Sept. 12) when it travels to Clemson. The Tigers are ranked No. 12 in the preseason Associated Press poll and open the campaign on Saturday versus Wofford.

• At the peak of its dominance in NCAA Division I-AA/FCS, Appalachian State spent 110-straight weeks in The Sports Network's FCS Top 25 poll from Sept. 19, 2005-Sept. 9, 2014.

- Appalachian State scored 44 points or more four times over the last seven games of the 2014 season after doing so only eight times in its previous 60 games.
- The Mountaineers have also tallied at least 550 yards of offense three times in the last seven games after doing so only six times in the previous 60 games. Appalachian just missed reaching the 550-yard plateau a fourth time when it totaled 549 yards at Arkansas State on Nov. 15.
- Appalachian's 380 yards against UL Monroe on Nov. 8 were 137 more than Texas A&M managed against the Sun Belt's then-top-ranked defense the previous week.

- In its first season in the league, Appalachian State finished near the top of the Sun Belt in most of the major offensive statistical rankings.

- Appalachian State's 469 rushing yards against Georgia State on Nov. 1 of last season were the Mountaineers' most since they ran for 572 yards in a 52-28 win over Le-noir-Rhyme on Oct. 18, 1975.
- In its previous game (53-14 win at Troy on Oct. 18), Appalachian State posted its highest rushing total (441) since it had 448 yards on the ground in a 56-7 win over Jacksonville on Sept. 6, 2008.
- On Oct. 11 against Liberty, the Mountaineers notched season highs for total yards (637), passing yards (397), yards per pass

attempt (12.8), yards per completion (19.9), and yards per play (9.2).

- The Mountaineers' 637 yards against Liberty were their most since they amassed 684 total yards in a 55-14 win over Coastal Carolina on Sept. 29, 2012.

- Also against Liberty, Appalachian State had a 300-yard passer (**Taylor Lamb** - 397), two 100-yard rushers (**Marcus Cox** - 111 and **Terrence Upshaw** - 111) and a 100-yard receiver (**Malachi Jones** - 105) in the same game for the first time in school history.

- During its six-game winning streak to close the season, Appalachian State scored on 87.1 percent of its trips into the red zone (27-of-31). One of the four scoreless opportunities was a kneel-down at the five yard line to close out a 44-0 win over Georgia State.

- During a four-game losing streak from Sept. 20-Oct. 11, App State came away with points in just nine of its 18 trips into the red zone.

- In their two closest losses of last season (21-20 at Southern Miss on Sept. 20, 55-48 in overtime vs. Liberty on Oct. 11), the Mountaineers outgained their opponents by an average of 126.5 yards per game (455-329 at Southern Miss; 637-501 vs. Liberty). However, Appalachian totaled seven turnovers, missed four field goals and two extra points and was just 4-of-9 in the red zone in those two narrow defeats.

- The Mountaineers' 66 points against Campbell on Sept. 6 were the seventh-most in school history and the most since their 70-24 win over Wofford on Oct. 31, 2008.

- The Mountaineers' 45 first-half points against Campbell were their most in an opening half since they led Western Carolina 45-21 at halftime of a 79-35 win on Nov. 10, 2007.

- During last year's season opener at Michi-

gan, Appalachian State put together its longest drive in terms of plays in 25 years with a 19-play, 96-yard touchdown drive that started late in the third quarter and culminated with **Marcus Cox's** one-yard touchdown run with 9:05 to go in the ballgame.

- Prior to the opener at Michigan, Appalachian had not put together a 19-play drive since it marched 99 yards in 19 plays versus Marshall on Nov. 4, 1989. That drive was capped by a five-yard touchdown run by quarterback D.J. Campbell.

- The 96-yard drive was also the Mountaineers' longest in terms of yardage since they had a lightning-quick two-play, 97-yard series in the first quarter of a 55-14 win over Coastal Carolina on Sept. 29, 2012. Steven Miller began that possession with a 28-yard run and one play later, Jamal Londry-Jackson connected with Sean Price for a 69-yard touchdown pass.

- Since the beginning of the 2004 season (when Appalachian State started running its spread offense), the Mountaineers have scored 30 points or more 94 times in 145 games (64.8 percent of all games) and have scored 40 points or more 47 times (32.4 percent of all games).

- Appalachian's 55-48 loss to Liberty on Oct. 11 of last season marked only the second time in the last 71 games that Appalachian State has scored 30 or more points and lost.

- During that span, which dates back to Oct. 3, 2009, the Mountaineers are 40-2 when they have scored at least 30 points and just 7-22 when they fail to reach the 30-point plateau.

- In **Scott Satterfield's** two seasons as head coach, App State is 11-1 when it scores 30 points and 0-12 when it doesn't.

- Another offensive trend for Appalachian State is its propensity to win games when it commits to running the football. Since the beginning of the 2010 season, the Mountaineers are 25-2 when they run the ball 40 or more times and 12-21 when they run the ball less than 40 times.

- During that span, the only times that App State has rushed at least 40 times and lost was on Oct. 19, 2013 at Furman, when it ran the ball 43 times but had five turnovers in a 27-10 defeat, and on Sept. 20, 2014 at Southern Miss, when it ran the ball 47 times but had three turnovers and missed three field goals and an extra point in a 21-20 loss.

• Since moving to a spread offense at the beginning of the 2004 campaign, Appalachian State has gained 20 yards or more on 7.2 percent of its offensive plays (687 times in 9,512 plays).

• Last season, the Mountaineers gained 20 or more yards on 64 of their 877 offensive plays (7.3 percent), including a season-high eight versus Liberty (Oct. 11) and six at Troy (Oct. 18), Arkansas State (Nov. 15) and UL Lafayette (Nov. 22)

• Seventeen of Appalachian State's 20 longest plays of the 2014 season came in the last seven games of the campaign.

• Eight of Appalachian State's 11 offensive touchdown drives against Liberty (Oct. 11) and Troy (Oct. 18) lasted less than a minute (:08, :57, :35 and :11 against Liberty and :09, :36 and :40 at Troy).

• Prior to that two-game stretch, the last time the Mountaineers had four or more touchdown drives that lasted less than a minute in one game came in a 59-56 loss at Chattanooga on Oct. 30, 2004 when five of App State's eight touchdown drives took less than 60 seconds off the clock.

QUARTERBACKS

• As a redshirt freshman last season, quarterback Taylor Lamb became the first freshman to serve as Appalachian State's primary quarterback since Armanti Edwards in 2006.

• When he made his starting debut in Appalachian's third game of the season (Sept. 20 at Southern Miss), he became the first App State freshman to start any game at quarterback since DeAndre Presley started in place of an injured Edwards in the 2008 regular-season finale at Western Carolina (a 35-10 win on Nov. 22).

• When he was named Sun Belt Freshman of the Year following the 2014 campaign, Lamb joined Edwards as the only App State quarterbacks to ever be named conference Freshman of the Year (Edwards earned the honor in the Southern Conference in 2006).

• Lamb set Appalachian State records for passing yards (2,381) and touchdown passes (17) by a freshman, breaking Edwards' previous records of 2,251 passing yards and 15 touchdown passes.

• Lamb's 2,864 yards of total offense last season were the second-most by a freshman in Appalachian State history, behind only Edwards' 3,404 total yards in 2006.

• In 10 career starts, Lamb has accounted for 2,627 yards of total offense (1,179 passing, 262 rushing) and 20 touchdowns (16 passing, four rushing).

• On Nov. 8 of last season, Lamb engineered what proved to be the game-winning drive in the 31-29 win over ULM when he marched the Mountaineers 53 yards in 1:13 to set up **Bentlee Critcher's** game-winning 39-yard field goal with 29 seconds to go.

• Lamb became the first Appalachian State freshman quarterback to lead the Mountaineers to victory after trailing in the fourth quarter since Edwards led Appalachian back from a 17-10 fourth-quarter deficit in a 27-20 double-overtime win at Georgia Southern on Oct. 21, 2006.

• In reality, Lamb's game-winning drive against ULM could have been his third of the season.

• Exhibiting great poise for a signal-caller making his first collegiate start, Lamb engineered two fourth-quarter touchdown drives in Appalachian State's 21-20 loss at Southern Miss on Sept. 20. He led an eight-play, 74-yard touchdown drive, capped by a 10-yard touchdown pass to **Malachi Jones**, to knot the score at 14-14 with 5:08 to go. After USM retook a 21-14 lead with 2:22 left in the game, Lamb put together a 12-play, 75-yard drive that culminated with a two-yard touchdown pass to **Simms McElfresh** (the PAT was blocked).

• On Oct. 11 versus Liberty, Lamb led a 60-yard drive that culminated with the Mountaineers missing a would-be game-winning 32-yard field goal as time expired in regulation. App State went on to lose, 55-48, in overtime.

• Lamb's career-high 98 rushing yards at Troy on Oct. 18 were the most by an Appalachian State quarterback since DeAndre Presley ran for 264 yards in a snowy NCAA Division I FCS playoff win over Western Illinois on Dec. 4, 2010.

• Lamb was spectacular in his starting debut at Southern Miss (Sept. 20), completing 28-of-40 passes for 264 yards and two touchdowns and rushing eight times for 39 yards, good for 303 yards of total offense.

• Lamb's 28 completions at Southern Miss were the most-ever by an App State QB in his first start. His 264 passing yards ranked second all-time among Mountaineers making their first start (behind only Bake Baker's 298 yards against Marshall in 1996).

• Lamb made an impressive collegiate debut in Appalachian State's season opener at Michigan.

• His first collegiate series began at his own four yard line but he was unfazed, leading the Mountaineers to a 19-play, 96-yard touchdown drive — the Mountaineers' longest drive in terms of plays in 25 years. Lamb completed 5-of-9 passes for 37 yards and also ran for six yards during the 19-play scoring drive.

• Behind Lamb, a sophomore, the other five quarterbacks on Appalachian State's roster are all freshmen that have never appeared in a collegiate game — redshirt freshmen **J.P. Caruso** and **Curtis Fitch** and true freshmen **Daniel David**, **Jake Easter** and **Zeb Speir**.

• Caruso held off a challenge from David during fall camp to earn the job as Lamb's top backup heading into the 2015 campaign.

• Junior **Marcus Cox** enters his junior season on pace to become Appalachian State's all-time leading rusher.

• With 2,665 rushing yards through two seasons, Cox already ranks eighth in school history in career rushing yards and is on pace to break the school's all-time rushing record, held by Kevin Richardson (4,804 yards from 2004-07).

- With 109 rushing yards (6.1 avg.) in the season opener at Michigan, Upshaw became

the first Appalachian State player in 40 years to rush for 100 yards in his collegiate debut.

- The last Mountaineer to accomplish the feat was quarterback Robbie Price, who ran for 140 yards and a touchdown on just 18 carries against East Tennessee State on Sept. 7, 1974. Price was a sophomore playing in his first varsity game after quarterbacking Appalachian's junior varsity squad in 1973.

- Upshaw and Price are the only players to rush for 100 yards in an Appalachian State debut since the school began keeping full single-game records in 1959.

- Upshaw also became the first non-conference opponent to rush for 100 yards against Michigan since Air Force's Cody Getz had 130 yards on 20 carries against the Wolverines on Sept. 8, 2012. Upshaw is the only player to rush for 100 yards against Michigan in U-M's last 12 non-conference games, which includes two contests against Notre Dame and bowl matchups against South Carolina (2013 Outback Bowl) and Kansas State (2013 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl).

- With Upshaw slowed by the lower-body injury midway through last season, Ferguson emerged as a third threat at the running back position.

- Against Troy and Georgia State (Nov. 1), Ferguson recorded the first two 100-yard games of his career (107 at Troy and a career-high 123 vs. Georgia State).

- Ferguson's 7.7-yard rushing average (303 yards on just 38 carries) was easily tops on the squad in 2014, a yard-and-a-half better than **Taylor Lamb's** 6.2-yard average.

- After going three years without having two 100-yard rushers in a single game, Appalachian State accomplished the feat in three-straight games last season.

- Prior to accomplishing the feat three-straight times last season, Appalachian State had not had two 100-yard rushers in the same game since current New England Patriot Travaris Cadet had 133 yards and current Saskatchewan Roughrider Steven Miller had

**WIDE RECEIVERS**

- The most experienced and, perhaps, the most talented group on Appalachian State's roster is its wide receivers.
- Appalachian returns its top five wideouts from last season in terms of both receptions and receiving yards — seniors **Malachi Jones** (36 rec. for 585 yds. in 2014), **Simms McElfresh** (42 rec., 484 yds.), **Montez McGuire** (25 rec., 386 yds.) and **Bobo Beathard** (17 rec., 202 yds.) and sophomore **Shaedon Meadors** (15 rec., 287 yds.).
- In all, eight of the nine receivers that caught passes for the Mountaineers in 2014 are back in the fold this season (exception: Tanoi Sumler, who had 13 receptions for 142 yards last season).
- A former walk-on, McElfresh led the Mountaineers in receptions (42) and touchdown catches (5) last season.

- McElfresh is often the Mountaineers' No. 1 option on third downs. Twenty of his 42 receptions last season came on third down and 15 of those 20 third-down catches resulted in first downs and/or touchdowns.
- McElfresh's acrobatic touchdown catch in last season's opener at Michigan drew raves from several national media outlets and personalities. Most notably, *Sports Illustrated's* and NBC Sports' Peter King lauded the outstanding finger-tip catch in his weekly "Monday Morning Quarterback" column on Sept. 1, saying "That catch by Appalachian State's Simms McElfresh, I dare say, is one of the greatest catches I have ever seen."
- Jones led the Mountaineers with 585 receiving yards a season ago.
- Jones also led Appalachian with 25 "money catches" last season (catches that resulted in a first down and/or touchdown). 69.4 percent of his receptions in 2014 were "money catches."

- Jones is Appalachian State's active career leader among wideouts in games played (36), starts (22), receptions (99) and receiving yards (1,248).
  - Despite the presence of four prolific seniors at the position, the Mountaineers' biggest big-play threat at wideout is likely Meadors.
  - After being slowed by an illness that kept him out of action for much of Appalachian State's preseason camp, Meadors made his collegiate debut on Oct. 11 versus Liberty and electrified the home crowd with four receptions for 90 yards, including a 48-yard touchdown catch.
  - In back-to-back games against UL Monroe (Nov. 8) and Arkansas State (Nov. 15), Meadors gained national recognition for spectacular one-handed catches.
  - Against UL Monroe, Meadors made one of the best catches of the season in college football when he made a diving, one-handed grab at the one yard line for a 31-yard gain with 18 seconds to go in the first half. Meadors' unbelievable catch, which came in at No. 3 on Saturday night's ESPN *SportsCenter* "Top 10 Plays," set up a touchdown that gave the Mountaineers a 21-20 halftime lead.
  - The following week at Arkansas State, Meadors was a *SportsCenter* Top 10 nominee once again after making a one-handed 24-yard touchdown catch with five seconds left in the first half.
- TIGHT ENDS**
- On the flip side from the wide receivers, tight end is perhaps the least-experienced position on the Mountaineers' roster going into the 2015 campaign.
  - The only tight end on Appalachian State's roster with extensive playing experience at the position is junior **Barrett Burns**.
  - Burns owns 36 of the 37 total career receptions and 314 of the 334 total career yards by current Appalachian tight ends.
  - Besides Burns, junior **Michael Moll** has the

only other career reception among App State tight ends, a 20-yarder in last season's 66-0 win over Campbell.

- Two third-year sophomores — **Bill Cecil** and **Levi Duffield** — have moved from the defensive side of the ball to provide much-needed depth at tight end.
- Cecil and Duffield are prime candidates to fill the crucial blocking role at H-back that 2014 honorable-mention all-Sun Belt selection **Drew Bailey** was so proficient at over the second half of last season.
- The Mountaineers' depth at tight end has been hurt due to injuries to sophomore **Hunter Nunn** and true freshman **Collin Reed** that kept the duo out of action for much of preseason camp.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

- Despite losing four seniors to graduation that combined for a whopping 124 career starts, Appalachian State incredibly has four starters returning to its offensive line this season.
- While graduated seniors **Kendall Lamm** (42 starts), **Alex Acey** (33), **Graham Fisher** (29) and **Will Corbin** (20) combined for 124 career starts, only Lamm was a starter at the end of last season, as a talented group of youngsters forced their way into the lineup.
- Making the Mountaineers' talent at the position even more apparent is the fact that Corbin, who did not start a game last season, signed a free-agent contract with the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars. Lamm also signed an NFL free-agent deal with the Houston Texans.

- Despite losing 124 career starts to graduation, seven current Mountaineer offensive linemen have starting experience. Those seven have combined for 70 career starts between them.

\*Ten of Davante Harris' 16 career starts came on the defensive line before he moved to the offensive front in 2013, thereby reducing Appalachian State's number of starts at an offensive-line position to 60.

- As a unit, Appalachian State's offensive line only surrendered 11 sacks in 12 games last season, good for a tie for the third-fewest sacks allowed in NCAA Division I FBS.

• After surrendering 51 points and 544 yards per game in losses to South Alabama and Liberty on Oct. 4 and 11 of last season, respectively, Appalachian State's defense made a remarkable turnaround to become the Sun Belt Conference's top unit.

• Highlighting the late-season defensive surge, Appalachian State held a pair of bowl teams — Arkansas State (Nov. 15) and UL Lafayette (Nov. 22) — to 147 and 166 yards below their season averages, respectively, in the Mountaineers' 37-32 and 35-16 road wins.

• In its 44-0 win over Georgia State on Nov. 1, Appalachian State surrendered just 62 total yards, which is the fewest that the Mountaineers have allowed since Guilford managed just 39 yards in a 22-0 Appalachian win on Nov. 4, 1961.

• Georgia State's eight rushing yards were the fewest that Appalachian State has allowed since it surrendered just five in a 55-21 win over North Carolina Central on Oct. 10, 2009.

• Georgia State, which went into the contest with the nation's 15th-ranked passing offense (316.2 ypg), managed just 54 yards through the air against the Mountaineers (262 below its season average coming in). The 54 passing yards were the fewest in GSU's five-year program history (the previous low was 74 at Alabama in 2010, GSU's first season).

• The shutout against GSU was Appalachian State's second this season (66-0 vs. Campbell on Sept. 6) and the 22nd since Appalachian joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1972.

• The Mountaineers recorded two shutouts in a season for the first time since 1998, when they blanked VMI (51-0) and Eastern Kentucky (19-0) on back-to-back weeks (Nov. 7 and 14).

• Campbell and Georgia State each recorded only six first downs in their shutout losses to Appalachian State. The six first downs tied for the fewest allowed by an Appalachian State defense since Mars Hill moved the sticks only five times in the Mountaineers' 41-0 shutout victory in 2006.

• Between Troy's first possession on Oct. 18 (touchdown) and UL Monroe's first possession on Nov. 8 (field goal), Appalachian State's defense held its opponents scoreless for 22-straight series. App State forced 11 punts, four turnovers on downs, four fumbles and three interceptions during the impressive stretch.

• Thanks to its extraordinary second half of the season, Appalachian State led the Sun Belt in total defense in 2014, allowing just 347.5 yards per game (good for 25th nationally).

• Appalachian ranked among the Sun Belt leaders in a plethora of defensive statistical categories.

• Interceptions have long been a staple of App State's defense. In its final six seasons in the Southern Conference (2008-13), Appalachian led the league in interceptions four times and averaged 15.3 INTs per season (92 total).

• Since the beginning of the 2012 campaign, Appalachian State has tallied at least five tackles for loss in 27 of its 36 ballgames, including 18 times in 24 games since the beginning of the 2013 season.

• In all, the Mountaineers have notched 210 tackles for loss for 711 yards since the beginning of the 2012 campaign (5.8 TFL for 19.8 yards per game).

• Over the final seven games of last season, Appalachian racked up 44 tackles for loss for 178 yards.

• The Mountaineers' leader on the defensive line and, perhaps, the entire defense is junior end **Ronald Blair**.

• Blair, a senior who has started all 36 games that he has played in his Appalachian State career, led Appalachian State and ranked seventh in the Sun Belt with 6.0 sacks and 13.0 tackles for loss last season.

• Blair was one of seven Sun Belt student-athletes to rank among the conference's top 10 in both sacks and tackles for loss in 2014.

• Blair's 13.5 sacks and 34.5 tackles for loss in his career are both tops among current Mountaineers. His 150 total tackles rank second on the squad.



**DEFENSE**

- At the defensive end position opposite of Blair, **Nate Norwood** emerged as a force to be reckoned with late last season.

- Norwood did not make his first-career start until the ninth game of the season (Nov. 8 vs. UL Monroe) but flourished in the starting role.

- In his first start against ULM, he recorded six tackles, including 1.5 sacks and 1.5 tackles for loss. His six tackles against ULM were more than half as many as he recorded in the first eight games of the season combined (9).

- Norwood went on to record 21 tackles, 3.5 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss in four games as a starter last season and emerged from preseason camp with the starting assignment still in hand.

- At nose tackle, Appalachian State boasts a 320-pounder and 315-pounder to clog up the middle in juniors **Tyson Fernandez** and **Darian Small**.

- A former offensive lineman, Fernandez has tallied 31 tackles in just 14 career games at nose tackle.

- Fernandez missed the final two games of last season due to an upper-body injury sustained on Nov. 15 at Arkansas State.

- In Fernandez's absence, Small recorded four of his 10 tackles last season over the final two contests of the campaign.

- Appalachian's defensive line depth took a hit earlier this week when it was announced that senior end **Thomas Bronson** would miss the entire 2015 season due to a non-football injury. Bronson also missed the final eight games of the 2014 campaign due to a lower-body injury sustained in the Sun Belt opener at Georgia Southern.

**LINEBACKERS**

- Junior linebacker **John Law** has established himself as one of the Sun Belt Conference's top defensive players.

- After a slow start to the 2014 campaign (just 10 tackles over the first two games), Law exploded for 55 stops over the last 10 contests of the season.

- Law led the team and tied for 12th in the Sun Belt with 91 total tackles a season ago.

- He also tied for second on the squad with six tackles for loss, tied for fifth with two sacks, tied for second with four pass breakups and tied for third with two takeaways from his inside linebacker position.

- Law saved his best performance of the season for the finale versus Idaho, racking up 14 tackles against the Vandals. For his efforts, he was named Appalachian's first-ever Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week.

- Law's 16 tackles at Georgia Southern on Sept. 25, 2014 were the most by a Mountaineer last season.

- Law's eight stops at Southern Miss on Sept. 20, 2014 included a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss, which were tied for the most by a Mountaineer in any game in 2014.

- Despite only entering his junior season, Law leads all active Mountaineers with 164 career tackles.

- Pairing with Law at middle linebacker is sophomore **Eric Boggs**. Boggs started the final six games of last season as a true freshman and in his six starts, Appalachian State went 6-0 while the defense surrendered only 19.8 points and 267.8 yards per game.

- Appalachian State had two true freshman among its four starting linebackers last season. In addition to Boggs at ILB, true freshman **Devan Stringer** started the final seven games of last season at OLB and is slated to return to the role as a sophomore this season.

- Despite playing in only 10 games and making just 10 starts as a true freshman,

Stringer finished ninth on the team with 34 total tackles, tied for second with six tackles for loss and tied for fourth with two sacks.

- At the other outside linebacker spot, **Kennan Gilchrist** ranked fourth on the team with 44 tackles last season.

- Despite only having 13 career starts under his belt, Gilchrist ranks fourth among active Mountaineers with 103 career tackles. He also ranks second on the squad with 10.5 career tackles for loss and is tied for third with 3.0 sacks.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS**

- While prognosticators might point to Appalachian State's secondary as the most vulnerable part of the defense, the Mountaineers have six defensive backs with starting experience on the roster.

- The six defensive backs with starting experience have combined to make 55 career starts.

- As evidenced above, the strength in the Appalachian secondary lies with its safeties.

- The clear-cut leader of the pack is fifth-year senior **Doug Middleton**. Middleton has started 17-consecutive games since completely recovering from a severe foot injury early in his career.

- Middleton is the Mountaineers' only returning first-team all-Sun Belt Conference selection from a year ago.

- Last season, Middleton was the only Sun Belt student-athlete with at least four interceptions, 10 passes defended and 70 tackles. He finished tied for third in the league with a team-high four interceptions, ranked fourth in the conference with a team-high 10 passes defended and was tied for 24th in the Sun Belt with 74 total tackles (second on team).

- The Mountaineers' other two primary safeties, sophomore **A.J. Howard** and junior **Alex Gray**, boast 162 tackles between them despite having combined for just three years of experience.

- Howard started all 12 games as a true freshman last season and finished third on the

team and 37th in the Sun Belt with 64 total tackles last season.

- Howard's 64 tackles ranked eighth among all Sun Belt freshmen in 2014 and were the most by an Appalachian State freshman since Lanston Tanyi recorded 70 stops as a rookie in 2008.
- Howard's career-high 13 tackles in the Mountaineers' 55-48 overtime loss to Liberty on Oct. 11 were the most by an App State defensive back since Corey Lynch made 13 stops against Montana State in the second round of the 2006 NCAA Division I FCS playoffs.
- Gibbs is a clear-cut starter at one cornerback position after amassing 35 tackles, two interceptions and four pass breakups in just nine starts as a true freshman last year.
- Gibbs had the finest performance of his career on Oct. 18 at Troy with two interceptions and a career-high eight tackles.
- The lone position on defense that doesn't have a returning starter is the cornerback position opposite Gibbs, which was vacated by the graduation of 2014 honorable-mention all-Sun Belt selection Joel Ross (now a member of the Dallas Cowboys).
- Sophomore **Brandon Pinckney** appeared to be in line to earn the starting nod at the position after a strong spring. However, he sustained a season-ending knee injury early in preseason camp.
- With Pinckney out of the mix, the starting role has been earned by junior-college transfer **Mondo Williams**.
- True freshman **Tae Hayes** also impressed during camp and could push Williams for playing time at corner.

**SPECIALISTS**

- Special teams were undoubtedly the weak link of Appalachian State's team last season.
- Appalachian State ranked at or near the bottom of the 11-team Sun Belt Conference in virtually all special-teams categories in 2014, including eighth in PAT percentage (52-57 — .912), 10th in punt-return average (5.4 avg.), 11th in kickoff-return average (17.2 avg.), 11th in net punting (31.2 avg.), 11th in net kickoff coverage (34.7 avg.) and 11th in field-goal percentage (8-15 — .533).
- The special-teams struggles were especially apparent when the Mountaineers left 10 points on the field in the kicking game with three missed field goals and a missed PAT in a 21-20 loss at Southern Miss on Sept. 20.
- Two of the missed kicks (a field goal and the PAT) at Southern Miss were blocked.
- On Oct. 4 against South Alabama, Appalachian State had another field-goal attempt blocked and also lost a fumble on a muffed punt.
- On Oct. 11, Appalachian missed a would-be game-winning 32-yard attempt as time expired in the Mountaineers' 55-48 overtime loss to Liberty on Oct. 11.
- After being forced to handle all three aspects of the kicking game for much of last season due to an injury to place kicker **Zach Matics**, junior **Bentlee Critcher** is expected to return to his exclusive role as a punter in 2015.
- Critcher is looking to regain the form that saw him put together one of the best campaigns by a punter in Appalachian State history as a true freshman in 2013. His 45.9-yard punting average as a true freshman in '13 ranked fifth among all NCAA Division I punters and was the third-highest single-season average in Appalachian State history.
- Due in large part to the triple duty last season, Critcher's punting average dipped to 40.7 yards per punt in 2014, good for eighth in the Sun Belt.
- After a terrific offseason and preseason camp, Matics returns as the Mountaineers' place kicker.
- Matics was a perfect 12-for-12 (1-for-1 on field goals and 11-for-11 on extra points) prior to missing 4-of-5 kicks (three field goals and an extra point) at So. Miss on Sept. 20.
- Matics sustained an upper body injury against Georgia Southern on Sept. 25 and missed his fourth-straight field-goal attempt

on Oct. 4 against South Alabama when his 34-yard attempt was blocked, prompting the Mountaineers' coaches to use Critcher in the place-kicking role going forward.

- Despite its otherwise subpar special teams, the Mountaineers did score two special-teams touchdowns in 2014.
- On Nov. 1 versus Georgia State, Appalachian State pulled off a perfectly executed fake field goal to score a touchdown on the final play of the first half.
- The Mountaineers appeared content with the opportunity to stretch its 20-0 lead to 23-0 when they lined up for a 30-yard field goal with three seconds remaining in the first half. However, after GSU took three-straight timeouts, holder **Simms McElfresh** took the snap and ran through a gaping hole on the right side of the line for a 13-yard touchdown (the first rushing touchdown of his career).
- On Nov. 22 at UL Lafayette, **Bobo Beathard** returned a punt 33 yards for a touchdown to give Appalachian a commanding 14-3 lead late in the first quarter of an eventual 35-16 victory.
- Beathard's punt return for a touchdown was Appalachian State's first in more than eight years. Dexter Jackson was the last Mountaineer to take a punt back for a touchdown, doing so twice against Gardner-Webb on Sept. 23, 2006.



**MISCELLANEOUS**

**EXPERIENCED BUT YOUNG**

- Despite having 20 returning starters on offense and defense, Appalachian State still boasts a relatively young roster.
- Of the 105 student-athletes currently on the Mountaineers' roster, 57 are in their first or second year in the program (54.3 percent) and 81 are in their first three years in the program (77.1), compared to just 24 student-athletes (22.9 percent) that are in their fourth or fifth year in the program.
- Additionally, nearly half of the student-athletes listed on this week's depth chart are freshmen and sophomores (24 freshmen and sophomores among 53 total student-athletes listed).
- Last season, Appalachian State's roster included just 11 seniors, 32 upperclassmen and 47 freshmen. In 2013, the Mountaineers had just 11 seniors, 29 upperclassmen and 53 freshmen.

**WELCOME TO THE ROCK**

- Appalachian State enjoys one of the finest home-field advantages in the nation at Kidd Brewer Stadium, where the Mountaineers are 71-14 (.835) in 85 home games since the beginning of the 2003 season.
- Despite less-than-ideal weather for all six home contests in 2014, Appalachian State averaged 23,166 fans per game, good for third in the Sun Belt Conference and 20th among all "Group of Five" programs.

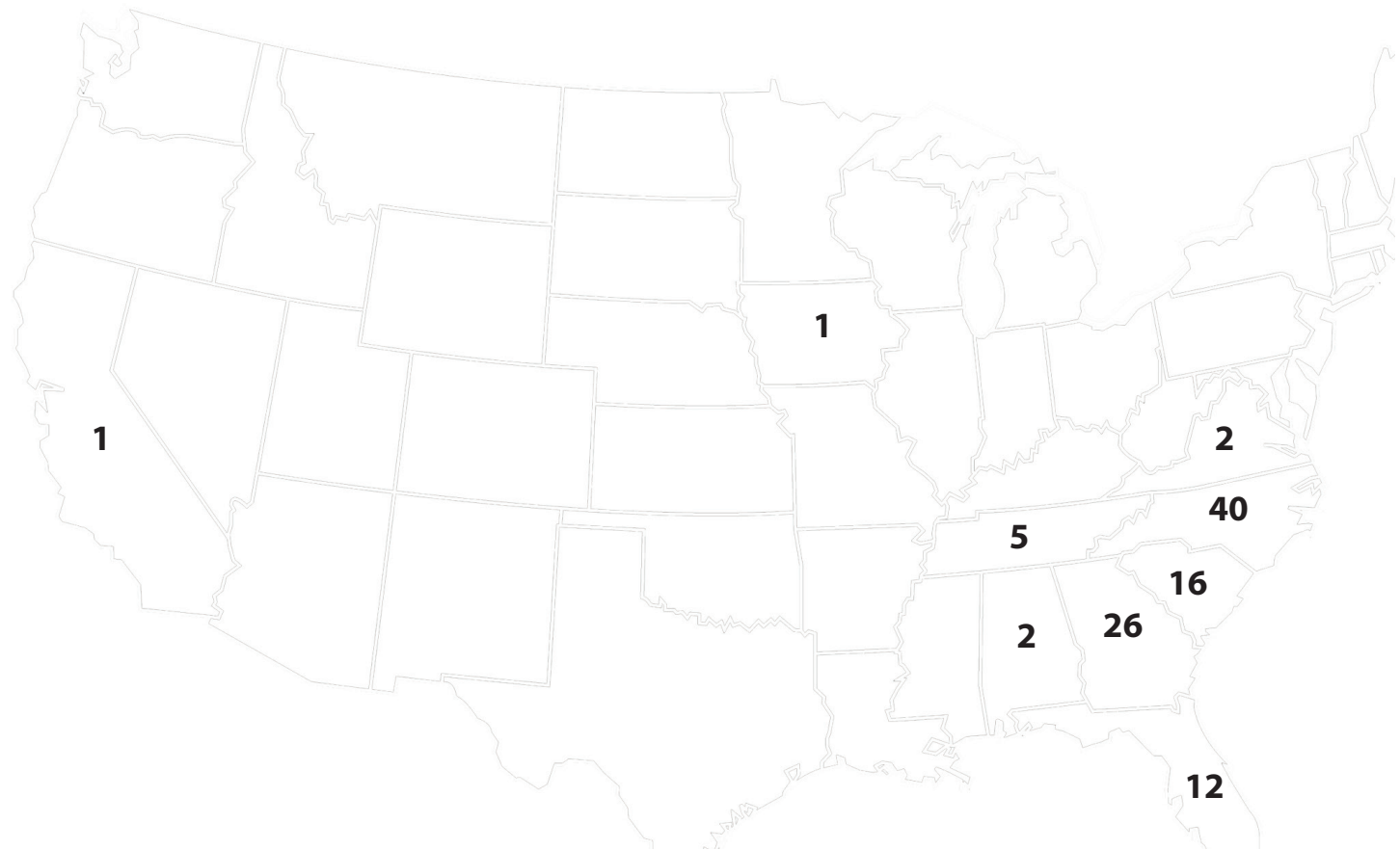
